# Amidah for Peace, Justice & Immigration

This alternative Amidah was used during Minchah (afternoon) prayers by members of the Reconstructionist Rabbinic Association outside of an Immigration Processing Center in order to call attention to the plight of immigrants and underscore the importance of the Jewish obligation to welcome the stranger. It follows the thematic structure of the amidah recited on weekdays is meant to be done as a call and response.

## Avot (Ancestors)

God of our ancestors. God of immigrants. God of refugees. We are border crossers. We tie our fate with You who cannot be contained by customs offices. You who requires no passport.

# Gevurot (Divine Strength)

You are the power that nurtures, You support the fallen, You free the captive, You give faith to those who sleep in the dust.

## Kedushah (Holiness)

We call out to each other, We turn in every direction, Your holy image is the face of every human.

# Binah (Understanding)

Help us to act with understanding.

## Teshuvah (Repentence)

Return us again and again to your service.

#### Selikhah (Forgiveness)

Forgive us for retreating to our own comfort, Forgive us for not taking responsibility, Forgive us for letting little fears Stop us from helping with compassion.

#### Ge'ulah (Redemption)

Release us from captivity, Release us from persecution, Release us from misfortune, Help us to heal when rational arguments are insufficient.

# Refuah (Healing)

Heal the suffering that causes people to flee their homes.

All Bountiful one let every person live with abundance.

#### Kibutz Galuyot (Gathering of the Exile)
