- According to the latest official statement from ENFEN (Multisectoral Commission for the National Study of El Niño Phenomenon), the status of "Coastal El Niño Alert" is maintained because its continuity is expected at least until winter of this year with a moderate magnitude, without ruling out that the strong magnitude could be reached in May.
- The United States National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Climate Prediction Center estimates that the coming weeks could cause an increase in the chances of heavy rains for northern Peru, which could affect response operations to the emergency.
- INDECI has reported that as of April 30, 67,882 people have been assisted, which implies that the gap of people with humanitarian needs still to be attended is hundreds of thousands of people.
- The Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF) allocated \$6.9 million to support relief operations to respond to a target population of 245,000 people with humanitarian needs, in addition to expanding presence in affected areas. Priority will be given to women, children, migrants and refugees, people with disabilities and the population living with HIV/AIDS.
- The collect of information by local municipalities through the application of the EDAN file (Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis) is at 70.5% of accounted damages, progress is expected to slow down due to the inaccessibility of some affected areas.

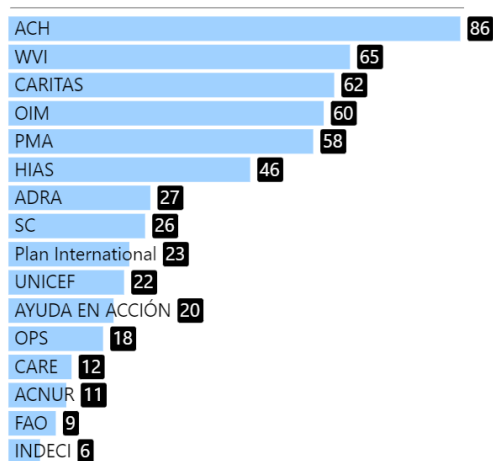
